SARAVANAMUTHU - SAUNDARIPILLAI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD 2006

The Saravanamuthu – Saundaripillai Memorial Scholarship is granted to members and the children of members who are pursuing a tertiary level education. 5. Ms Jashithra a/p Syamala Krishnan from Bukit Mertajam District is in the 1st year of the 5 year medical course leading to the Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery degree, at the Asian Institute of Medicine, Science and Technology, Sungai Petani, Kedah. She is a KJB member for 1 year.

Education Fund For Medical Study in Malaysia – set up by Dato Seri N.T. Rajah

MADAM NAGASUNDRAM NADARAJAH EDUCATION FUND.

The Madam Nagasundram Nadarajah Education Fund established on 13th November 1994, and was set up by Dato' Seri N.T. Rajah in honour of his mother.

The fund grants loans to the members and children of members to pursue a course in medicine in any local institution of higher learning. The award carries an amount of RM4000 per year during the duration of the course.

The second recipient of the award is Ms Janani a/p Thambipillay. She is in the third year of the five year medical course leading to the Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery degree, at the Asian Institute of Medicine Science and Technology, Sungai Petani, Kedah. She will be graduating in 2008. She and her

parents are KJB members in Brickfields District. The award was presented to Ms Janani by Madam Nagasundram Nadarajah on Sunday 22nd January, 2006 10.30 a.m. at her residence in Bangsar. Present at the function were Dato' Seri N.T. Rajah and his family; Mr Thambipillay, the father of Ms Janani, and Board Members. The occasion was made even more significant, as it was also the birthday of Madam Nagasundram Nadarajah.

The Madam Nagasundram Nadarajah Education fund has already given out a loan to one member for 2 years totalling RM8,000/-. He is Dr Albert Navin Durairatnam who received his award in 1998, during the 3rd year of his 5 year Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery course at the University of Malaya. He graduated in July, 2000.

Kawasan General Meeting Year 2006

The Kawasan General Meetings for the year 2006 was held between 25th March and 30th April, 2006 covering a total of 15 Kawasans. As per the By-laws of KJB the kawasan meeting exercise is conducted to elect the delegates who would represent their respective kawasans for a two year term. The delegates duly elected at the Kawasan General Meetings would be eligible to attend the Annual General Meetings and Special General Meetings during the tenure of their two-year term.

With the recent amendments to the relevant provisions of the By-laws relating to organisation and management of the society, each Kawasan is eligible to elect the delegates in the ratio of one delegate for the first 20 members and subsequently in the ratio of one delegate for every additional 50 members.

The quorum for the kawasan meeting has also been reduced to 1/3 or 10 members. The amendments were aimed at eliminating the problems faced by smaller kawasans which would otherwise be deprived of the right to be represented at the AGMs and SGMs.

Out of a total of 5236 members on the membership register, a total of 4842 members were in benefit and were eligible to participate in the Kawasan meetings. A total of 993 members attended the kawasan meetings. A total of 101 members were duly elected as delegates. They will continue to hold the delegate status until the next Kawasan meeting exercise which will be held in 2008.

THE WHITE ENVELOPE IS STRICTLY FOR CONFIRMATION SLIP

Members Statement of Account is annually sent to every member. Enclosed together with that statement is a self-addressed postage prepaid white envelope. It is addressed to the External Auditors of JCS.

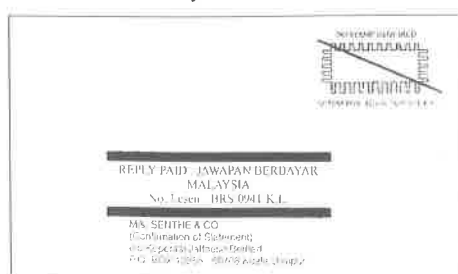
The external auditors of JCS requires a confirmation /feedback from the members with regard to the accuracy of the respective member's accounts. The white envelope is solely used for such confirmation and is clearly indicated on the envelope. These

sealed envelopes meant for the external auditor is not opened by JCS office but passed on to the external auditor for necessary action.

Members are therefore requested not to enclose any payments, letters in the white envelope which should only carry the confirmation slip.

In the past, there has been cases where payment cheques were found enclosed when the external auditor opened the covers expecting to find the confirmation slip. The opening of the covers by the external auditors is done after two to three months from the date of dispatch of the statement of account. The member's record at the HQ would obviously indicate non-payment as the office is not in receipt of the cheque.

We, therefore, seek the members cooperation to ensure that only the confirmation slip is enclosed in the white envelope which is at the disposal of the external auditor JCS.



FURNISH US WITH DETAILS OF YOUR E-MAIL ADDRESS AND HAND PHONE NUMBER FOR SMS.

The Pengerusi Lembaga in his address at the AGM 2006 emphasised the need to maintain an updated membership record. He made special reference to e-mail address and hand phone numbers of members in order that a speedier channel of communication can be established.

WHY JOIN KJB AT 18

THE SOCIETY WILL CREDIT RM50/- TO YOUR CREDIT IF

An eligible person who enrolls himself or herself on attaining the age of 18 years and maintains a continuous membership of 3 years will receive a cash incentive.

The Society will credit RM50/- to the subscription account as an incentive for the timely response and for the continuity of membership with the Society.

One of the eligibility requirement for the Educational Incentive Award for the SPM is that the student applying for the award is required to become a member of the Society on attaining 18 years of age. Applicants who have not attained the eligibility age of 18 years will be advised to become a member on attaining 18 years of age.

MECHANISM TO WITHDRAW YOUR SUBSCRIPTION WITHOUT LOSING YOUR BENEFITS WITH KJB

WITHDRAWAL OF YOUR SUBSCRIPTION

The KJB would like the members to know that they are entitled to withdraw 80% of their subscription credit, provided they meet the following criteria:

- Members after 10 years of membership can make a withdrawal, Subsequent withdrawals can be made after a lapse of every 10 years from the previous withdrawal.
- Members aged above 55 years can make a withdrawal after a lapse of every 5 years from the previous withdrawal.
- Members aged above 60 years can make a withdrawal after a lapse of every 3 years from the previous withdrawal.

In all the cases, there must be a subscription credit balance of RM1,200.00 after the 80% withdrawal.

GUIDE LINES FOR PAYMENT BY CHEQUE

Members are kindly advised to observe the following conventional guide lines when making payment to the Society:-

- * Payee : The cheque should be written in favour of '**KOPERASI JAFFNESE BERHAD**'
Cheques, Money Orders, Bank drafts, Postal Orders made out in favour of any other name other than as above will not be accepted by the Bank.
A fee of RM10/- will be automatically debited to the drawers account if the cheque is rejected.
- * Amount in words : To be correctly written and ending with 'ONLY'?
- * Amount in words and figures : To ensure that the words and figures do not differ.
- * Writing : To ensure that the writing is not superimposed or overwritten.
- * Date / Signature : To ensure that the date and signature is on the cheque.
- * Alteration : Do not make any alteration on your cheque.
Ensure adequate fund arrangements for amount drawn (To avoid the cheque being dishonoured).
Do not fold/crumble/mutilate your cheques.

To enable the Society's office to proceed with the necessary action members are kindly requested to adhere to the procedure as follows:

- All payment to the Society to be accompanied by the Pay-in-Slip (yellow slip indicating the amount for each type of payment e.g. subscription, Credit Loan, Land & Building Loan etc.
- To write the name and correct membership number in the pay-in-slip.
- To fill up one pay-in-slip for one member.
- Members making payment through BSN etc should fax the copy of pay-in-slip to the KJB office with the following information written on the copy of the receipted pay-in-slip:-

OBITUARY

Ex-Treasurer of JCS passed away

The Board of Management JCS and the members learnt with sadness the demise of Mr S. Rajalingam AICA on 12.08.2006. Funeral was held on the following day (13/08/2006).

The late Mr S. Rajalingam served on the Board of Management JCS as a Hon. Treasurer from 1979 to 1988 and is one of the long serving Treasurers of JCS. TEMPLE WORSHIP FOR HINDUS

By S. Senthevadivel

Temple play a pivotal role in the life of every Hindu. It is the centre of religion, culture, social interaction and the propagation of human values.

Temple worship is very important, as it is here, in God's home and consecrated abode, that we nurture our relationship with the Divine. A Temple connects the divine and the material, the spirit and the body and is designed to bring the soul closer to God. *"When the spiritual energy Sakthi, invoked by the Pooja, permeates the sanctum sanctorium and floods out to the world, Hindus know they are in a most holy place where God and the Gods commune with them"* – *Dancing with Siva – Page 299"*

Temple worship is only as meaningful and effective as we make it. Before attending *Pooja* in a Temple, we should carefully bathe the body, rinse the mouth and dress in fresh clothing – Saris for women and Veshti's for men. The chanting of mantras or God's names silently or aloud frees the mind from worldly matters.

Just as one dresses immaculately when visiting the home of a dignitary, the same is equally applicable when we visit the home of God. The Sari has been specifically prescribed for women, as this fully cover the entire anatomy and hence removes unnecessary distraction. Devotees can be fully focussed in their communion with God. A Temple is surely not the place for plunging necklines, tight jeans and "Baby T's" with navels exposed.

A Temple, being the homes of the Gods and God, should be approached with great reverence and humility. *Draw near a Temple as you would approach a King, anticipating with a little trepidation, your audience with him"* *"Dancing with Siva – Page 301"*

With offerings in hand (usually fresh flowers and fruits), leave your shoes outside, wash your hands, feet and mouth and walk through the "*Rajagopuram*". The passage through the "*Rajagopuram*" energises the soul, and prepares you for your meeting with God.

Seek Lord Ganesha's blessings at his shrine first and the circumbulate the central sanctum, usually three times before returning to its entrance for worship. During "*Pooja*", stand with hands folded or clasped and recite mantras or hymns, in praise of God. One is fully energised in the process. After the "*Arathi*", a devotee is required to, prostrate in obeisance to God, rise to receive the "*Prasadam*" accepting them in the right hand. A devotee is required to sit quietly in the Temple for a short while and then circumbulate the Temple one final time before taking leave.

The "*Vedas*" affirm *"If a man first takes firm hold on faith, and then offers his sacrifice, then in that man's sacrifice, both Gods and men place confidence"*.

Sree Meenakshi Temple, Madurai – The Athens of South India

Introduction

Madurai, well known as a pilgrim centre today is one of the oldest cities in South India. For the last 2,000 years, it has been a great centre of South Indian culture and civilization. In India, the history and culture of a region often centres around a temple. This is particularly true of South India where the temple has made a unique contribution not only to the religious life of the people but also served as the nucleus around which the social and cultural life of the people revolve.

Though many cities could boast of ancient origins, not all of them could claim a continuous history. The great cities of Kancheepuram, Thiruchirapalli, for instance, are unquestionably ancient centres like Madurai. But they have not had an unbroken history and they were pre-eminent only during comparative short periods.

Madurai, however is one of the few cities to have enjoyed continuous history which could be traced back to prehistoric times. The *sthalapuranas* speak of its hoary antiquity of when, it is said, Parvathi and Shiva ruled over Madurai and the Pandya territory. Whether as a temple city or as a capitol city, the history of Madurai is distinct from that of other cities.

The Madurai temple is not only of hoary antiquity but possesses an entire *puranam* of its own relating to the *lilas* (miracles) of Sundareswarar, the deity of Madurai. This *puranam* known as *Hoysala Mahatmyam* or *Thiruvilaiyadal* in Tamil narrates the 64 *lilas* performed by the God. All the *lilas* are centred around the Madurai Temple or its neighbourhood. The cultural prominence of Madurai in the ancient times has earned for the city the epithet "The Athens of South India". As the seat of the Tamil academy called the Sangam it wielded great influence in the literary and cultural fields. Madurai has been in a sense an international metropolis with overseas commercial and cultural contacts with distant countries of the ancient world in the east and the west.

It is said that the name Madurai is derived from the Tamil word *madhuram* meaning sweetness. The Madurai Sthalapuranas state that when King Kulasekhra Pandyan first built the city, God sprinkled the whole town with drops of sweet nectar (*amirtham*) to purify and bless the city. Hence the city came to be known as Madurai. The name Madurai seems to have been a favourite one in early ages for we find places so named in Sri Lanka, Burma and Indonesia.

The Legendary Origin of the Madurai Temple

The legendary origin of the Madurai Temple leads to the discovery by Indran of the Swayambhu Lingam in the Kadamba forest. Indran worshipped the Lingam and built a small temple around it. The shrine is called the Indra Vimana. It is believed that it is this Lingam which is still under worship in the Madurai Temple. Ever since, the temple has been in worship and has since grown to be the enormous complex as is seen today.

Once Dhananjaya, a merchant, having been overtaken by night fall in the Kadamba forest, spent the night in the Indra Vimana. The next morning when he woke up, he was surprised to see signs of worship. Thinking that this must be the work of Devas, he told the Pandya Kulasekhra, in Manavur of this. Meanwhile, Lord Shiva had instructed the

Pandya in a dream to build a temple and a city at the spot as would be indicated by Dhananjaya. Kulasekhara did so. Thus originated the temple and the city.

When the next Pandya, Malayadhvaja, and his queen Kanchanamala, performed a sacrifice for a child, Lord Shiva caused Goddess Parvathi Herself to transform as a little girl. Lord Shiva told the couple that they were to name her Thadathagai and bring her up as if she was a boy. They were also told that Thadathagai would eventually set her eyes on someone who would become her husband. She succeeded her father to the throne at his death. She gained many military victories. Finally, she marched to Mount Kailas and saw Lord Shiva. He told her to return to Madurai and said that He would marry her there. The divine marriage was celebrated. The crowning of Meenakshi, for She was the same Thadathagai, is celebrated as a festival in the temple.

Sree Meenakshi's wedding scene is found in one of the mandapams of the temple. The majestic appearance of the bridegroom (Lord Shiva), the shyness and the sweet smile expressed in the eyes and lips of the bride (Sree Meenakshi) and the manner in which Lord Vishnu gives away the bride, are very realistic.

One of the great festival celebrated in Madurai annually is the bringing of the image of Lord Alagar of Sri Kallalagar Koil to the Vaigai river. The tradition is that Lord Alagar, the brother of Goddess Meenakshi comes to Madurai to attend Her wedding. On reaching the Vaigai river,

he came to know that the marriage celebration has already taken place. He then returns to the Kallalagar Koil located in Alagar Hill.

Lord Shiva performed many miracles. These are described in a celebrated poem, the 'Thiruvilayadal Puranam'. It was written by Paramjothi Munivar in the 16th century. The 'Thiruvilayadal Puranam' is regarded as temple *sthalapuranam*.

According to the *puranam*, Lord Shiva ruled the land as a mortal King under the name of Sundara Pandyan for some years. After accomplishing many marvels, Lord Shiva made his son Lord Muruga to be born as his mortal son. This boy was named Ukkira Pandyan (Pandyan of Valour). After the coronation of this prince, Lord Shiva in his mortal form and His consort, Thadathagai, entered the temple and assumed divine forms as Somasundarar and Meenakshi. Later, on occasions, the Lord came down to earth and indulged in a number of *thiruvilayadals*.

Location

The modern city of Madurai is about 345 miles to the south of Chennai. The Madurai district of which it is the capital is bounded by the Coimbatore and Thiruchirappalli districts on the north, by Trichinopoly and Ramanadu districts on the east; by the Ramanadu district on the south; and by Thiruvananthapuram-Cochin state on the west. The district of Madurai comprises of eight taluks of Dindigul, Kodaikanal, Madurai, Melui, Nilakkottai, Palani, Periyakulam and Thirumangalam. Beside Madurai city, the chief towns in the district are seven taluk headquarters after which the taluks are named and Bodinayakkanur and Ultamapalayam in Peryakulam taluk.

The temple

While the temple originated in times to which no date can be assigned, the structures that are standing today date mostly from the 12th to the 18th century.

The Meenakshi Temple buildings occupy an area of 847 feet x 792 feet. On the massive outerwalls stand four towers, the tallest of which is the south tower which is 169 feet high, with parabolic curves. The four main outer gopurams on the east, west, north and south of the temple have a singular beauty and grace of their own. There are no less than 12 gopurams and innumerable mandapams (pavalions).

The builders of the Madurai Temple had a fine sense of artistry and the towering

outer gopurams are standing monuments to their genius. The Hall of Thousand Pillars has only 985 pillars in the hall and are so arranged that from whichever angle one views, they appear in a straight line. The Golden Lily Tank is located within the temple premises.

There are two main shrines often called double shrine, one devoted to God Sundareswarar and the other to His consort, Goddess Meenakshi. It is a convention in this temple, different from that followed in others, that the devotee offers worship first to Goddess Meenakshi. Therefore, while there are four other entrances into the temple, under huge gopuras in the four cardinal directions, it is customary to enter not through any of them but through a mandapam with no tower above it. The entrance leads directly to the shrine of the Goddess.

Daily pujas and annual festivals

Daily Pujas

The temple is opened at 5.00am. The *Thiruvananthal* puja is performed at 5.30am for Arulmigu Meenakshi Amman shrine. Immediately, from the *Palliyarai* (bedroom) Chokkar (Lord Shiva) is carried in a *palakku* (palangin) to the Swamy Shrine and when Lord Shiva reaches the shrine, the sanctum-sanctorium is opened and routine pujas commence. The daily pujas or *abishegam* and thereafter *aarathanas* are performed according to scheduled timing. From 12.30 pm to 4.00pm the temple will be kept closed. At 4.00pm the temple re-opens for *darshan*. However, during festivals, the timings of the daily pujas are subject to change.

Annual festivals

Many festivals of the Madurai Temple have an ancient tradition behind them and they seem to have continued to be observed in the same manner to date. During the 12 months of the Tamil calendar year, there is a festival in the temple every month. The festivals include Chithirai Brahamostava, Vasantham, Unjal, Aadi Mulai Kottu, Aavani Moolam, Navarathiri, Kolattam, Thiru Karthigai Deepam, Thiruvathirai-Arudhra Darshan, Thepporstavam, Masi Mandala utsavam and Summar Vasantham Festivals. Most of the festivals are celebrated for about 10 days except for the Masi Mandala utsavam which last for 48 days. The Chithirai Brahamostava festival includes the celebration of Arulmigu Meenakshi

Coronation, Her wedding to Arulmigu Sundareswarar and Temple car procession.

Conclusion

The great temple of Madurai has suffered much owing to the vicissitudes of fortune. The temple fabric has been destroyed much through age and more through vandalism. It has been renovated from time to time. Many parts of the temple are therefore of a comparatively late period. Fortunately, several vestiges of the early structures still remain here and there.

It has been stated that in the fourteenth century, an invasion by Malik Kafur damaged the temple. In the same century Madurai was under Muslim rule for nearly fifty years. The temple authorities closed the sanctum, covered up the Lingam, and set up another in the ardhmandapam. When the city was liberated, the sanctum was opened, and it is said that the flower garlands and the sandalwood paste placed on the Lingam were as fresh as on the first day and the two oil lamps were still burning.

It is only in recent times that the temple has come to be popularly known as Meenakshi-Sundareswarar temple or even more briefly Meenakshi Amman temple. This does not, however, mean that 'Meenakshi Amman' came into prominence only in recent times. The very legendary origin of the temple is based on Meenakshi's rule and the marriage of Meenakshi and Sundareswarar.

Madurai has indeed become the greatest tourist attraction. It leaves indelible impression in the minds of the tourist and enriches their knowledge of the TAMILIAN art, architecture and culture. The soaring towers will continue to attract the visitors again and again to this great temple city.

UNCLAIMED MONEY ACT 1965 AND OBLIGATION OF JAFFNESE CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT

The unclaimed moneys act 1965

The Act spells out the responsibilities of entities who are subjected to the provisions of this act. Entities within the context of this Act which includes:-

- Companies registered under the Companies Act 1965.
- Board established to manage funds relating to the retirement benefits.
- Societies and Cooperative Societies.
- Corporations, public authorities trade union and firms.

2. Unclaimed moneys

Basically unclaimed moneys are :

- Moneys which are legally payable to the owner but have a remained unpaid for a period of not less than twelve months.
- Moneys standing the credit of an account that has not been operated by the owner by way of deposit or withdrawal for a period of less than seven years such as savings and current a/c or fixed deposits.
- Accounts of trade creditors that have not been operated by any transaction for a period of not less than two years.

3. The obligation of JCS under the provisions of the Unclaimed Moneys

The Act applies to JCS just as it does to other Societies and Cooperative Societies. In this respect JCS HQ is required to register details of those unclaimed moneys in the prescribed form and submit the original to the Registrar of (Unclaimed Moneys) and a copy extended to the Government Printers for the purpose of gazetting.

Our HQ will then hold the unclaimed money for a period of twelve months from the date of submission of the form to the Registrar. During this period the Society could effect refund if the owners (members) come forward to claim their money from the Society.

4. Heavy Penalty imposed for non-compliance

Any entity who fails to comply with the provisions of the Act shall be guilty of an offence

punishable with a fine of up to RM3,000/- and thereafter with a further fine up to RM100/- for each day during which such failure continues.

5. Refund of Unclaimed Moneys

Refund of unclaimed money is possible that the claimant satisfy the Registrar that he/she is the rightful owner or that he/she has a legal right over the money to be claimed.

6. Tracing the owner (member) of unclaimed money

There are many reasons where moneys remain unclaimed. The members fall in arrears of payment and thereafter reminder letters sent out to members but no response. Attempts to contact the members would then become difficult.

The Society having exhausted all avenues would then proceed with action to remove such members from the membership register after a period of 6 to 8 months. The subscription at the credit of the member less amount owing is refunded to the members. Some cheques are undelivered.

Every endeavour is made by JCS to locate members in order to deliver the cheque. One such method is by publishing in the Pathfinder with the name and last known address in the hope, some member could assist us as to the whereabouts of the member. In this respect the Society also seek the assistance of the respective JCS District.

Although the Society would prefer to retain the money until it reaches the rightful or legal claimant but such an act would be deemed to have contravened the Act and is punishable with heavy fine. The Board of Management being the custodian of the members money is certainly not willing to pay the fine.

AMENDMENTS TO THE KJB RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE AT THE 75th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND THE 9th DELEGATES MEETING OF KOPERASI JAFFNESE BERHAD HELD ON 18TH JUNE, 2006.

1. REGULATION 1. MONTHLY SUBSCRIPTION

- (iv) Member admitted upon attaining the age of 18 years but before the 19th birthday and who has completed a continuous membership of 36 months shall have RM50.00 credited to the subscription. {AGM 2006}

2. REGULATION 5x (a) and 5x (c)

5. Loan and its Repayment

- x(a) Collateral security in the form of a mortgage or charge of immovable property found to be legally enforceable, may be accepted by the Lembaga and the quantum of the loan shall not exceed 80% of the value of the property or RM100,000.00 (for a single loan) or RM 200,000.00 (for a joint loan) whichever is less. {AGM 2006}

- x(c) Repayment of such loan shall be by monthly instalments within the stipulated period as per Rule (vi). The member shall be given the option to repay only the interest for the first 36 months and thereafter the full loan instalment within the balance period or earlier. However, the maximum period of the loan shall be 120 months or the member attaining the age of 65. During the duration of the loan the member should pay a minimum subscription as per regulation 1(i). (AGM 2006)


