## THE QUANTUM OF LAND AND BUILDING LOAN INCREASED TO RM100,000/-

The Board of Management tabled an amendment to the Rules and Regulations of KJB. Presently under Rule 6 relating to Land and Building Loan, the maximum loan granted to each member is RM80,000 or RM160,000 in the case of joint applications with the

repayment period up to 20 years.

At the AGM 2002 the House approved the amendment to Rule 6. With the amendment, the maximum loan has been increased to RM100,000 per member or a maximum RM200,000 in the case of a joint application

by 2 or more members. The repayment period for the loan is extended from the present 20 years to 25 years. However the loan amount should be repaid on or before the completion of 65 years of age by the borrower(s). In moving the amendment to the Rules & Regulations, the

Pengerusi Lembaga Mr P. Vamathevan explained that the amendment is made to enable the younger generation to avail the loan. The repayment period is stretched out to 25 years. This would allow younger members to repay an affordable quantum.

### KJB OFFERS CHEAPER LOANS THAN THE FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

**O**ur housing loans are cheaper than the loans offered by other financial institutions. This was said at the AGM 2002 held on 21.04.2002.

This was told in reply to the call made by the delegates who urged the Society to provide cheaper housing loans in order to attract our members to avail the KJB loan facilities.

A comparison was made to financial institutions who waived the interest for the first 2 or 3 years.

However, interest free loans for the first 2 to 3 years could be substantial savings for the members

but thereafter the Principal & BLR is being imposed. The variance in BLR would mean that the quantum of repayment varies and that the borrower must be prepared to face such changes. In KJB the monthly repayment is constant and the borrower would be able to know in advance his monthly commitment as repayment towards the loan.

The table below provides a comparison of the Housing Loan offered by KJB with that of a financial institution for an amount of RM100,000 for a 20 year period.

## PAST NOTES

# MANAGEMENT OF THE SOCIETY IN THE EARLY YEARS

In the annals of history of Jaffnese Cooperative Society, the date 25th of January 1931 was considered a significant date. For on this day at 10.00 a.m. 41 invited members and members of the Board met in the Town Hall to endorse on the proposed formation of Sub-committees in Kuala Lumpur. Let us go back in time and attend their meeting:-

The Society's President Mr R.N. Thamby Thurai chairs the meeting. The President in a lengthy speech reviews the history of the 6 years of the Society from its inception, making reference to details at various stages of its onward progress, viz; changes in office-bearers, appointment of full-time officers as Secretary and Treasurer, the reasons for reverting subsequently to the old system of having honorary officers for these two appointments, the fall in membership, the amount of over-due loan instalments and subscriptions.

The President, then points out that Kuala Lumpur is too unwieldingly an area to be managed without small consultative bodies and stresses on the advisability of having the Kuala Lumpur area divided into several small areas with a sub-committee to service each area. This was agreed to and the division results as follows:

- (1) Brickfields Road.
- (2) Bangsar and Travers Roads.
- (3) Scott Road, High Street and Kampong Attap.
- (4) General Hospital.
- (5) Bukit Bintang Road, Galloway Road and Weld Hill Area.
- (6) Imbi Road.
- (7) Pasar Road
- (8) Sungei Besi, Pudu and Lok Yew Roads.
- (9) District Hospital, Princess Road.
- (10) Sentul No. 1 - Main Avenue.
- (11) Sentul No. 11 - Housing Scheme.

The number of members for each sub-committee is fixed at a minimum number and the basis of representation in the Committee is to be one representative for every 10 members.

It is decided that the quorum for meetings of the sub-committee is to be three and that in no case it shall be less than

one - third of the total number of members in the committee.

The President then reads out proposed By-laws defining the duties and responsibility of sub-committees and makes explicit that the General Committee (Board of Management) would always be prepared to act on the majority opinion of the sub-committee. (*The provisions contained in the proposed by-laws was for most part similar to the present District Rules & Regulations of KJB*).

The President mentions that the Sub-committee keep a membership register, Cash book, minutes Book and Receipt Book as records of the Sub-Committees. The President explains lucidly the system for making collections by the Sub-committees and the manifest reasons for them to bear the brunt of responsibility with regard to these collections. The holding of joint meetings (Management /Sub-committee) monthly is agreed.

The President emphasises on the desirability of restricting membership to one Society in the light of his experience and urges all members to act on the suggestion. He also points out that though the ultimate decision in the matter rests on the individual concerned, the communal society's undisputed greater claim must receive careful consideration.

The President explains the proposal to form a Jaffnese Cooperators Club and states that the greatest objective in view, is the consolidation of the Society. He adds that through its medium it is expected to bring about a close touch with the members of the Society and to enable the General Committee to get, as far as possible a representative opinion on a question of major importance affecting the Society. After discussion for some time the subject is allowed to stand over the next meeting. There being no other matters of importance, the meeting adjourns with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

The next joint meeting scheduled on 24.03.1931 at 5.15 p.m. at the Society's office is attended by the following 24 representatives.

## AGM ENDORSES THE FORMATION OF LADIES & YOUTHS COMMITTEES

The delegates at the 71st Annual General Meeting held on 21st April, 2002 endorsed the proposal that the Ladies Wing and Youths Wing should exist as sub-committees under the purview of the Lembaga and that the Lembaga's to draw up the terms of reference for both the proposed sub-committees.

The Lembaga without wasting much time swung into action. It decided to seek the views of the District officials Ladies and Youths representatives. Towards this end a meeting session was scheduled on 15th June, 2002 (Saturday) at 4.00 p.m. at the Kalamandapam, Lorong Scott, Kuala Lumpur.

Invitations were extended to a total of 64 members which included all the youth delegates.

A total of 52 members attended the meeting session. Handouts were distributed to the members present. The handouts contained the organisational structure of the Kawasan/Districts and Board of Management and extracts of KJB By laws, Rules & Regulations relevant to the issue. The members then presented their view points to the Board. There was a consensus of views that the KJB Districts should encourage the participation of the ladies and youths at the District level and also agreed to the proposed sub-committees. The following are some extracts from the minutes of the meeting session held on 15.06.2002.

**Miss Rasamani Kandiah** the Chairperson of PJ District supported the establishment of a sub-committee for Ladies which could coordinate on matters relating to women's affairs. She said that there are a lot of courses, seminars etc for women which could greatly benefit the lady members of KJB. The re-establishment of the sub-committee would greatly facilitate in the coordination with the ladies in the Districts. She also stated that the Ladies sub-committee should be made responsible for matters relating to the National Council of Womens Organisation. She observed that the activities are mostly participated by women from Wilayah Persekutuan. She suggested that the offers must be extended to Districts outside Wilayah so as to give opportunities to women who are located in other states.

**Mr P. Sahathevan** Chairman Klang District said that his district members talk less and do more work. He cited instances where the youths of Klang District were involved in activities. Mr M. Senathipathy, Chairman Seremban District said that the Seremban District has always in mind to bring in ladies and youths into the fold. In this respect the District went on a recruitment campaign trying to get youths but was disappointed with the response. He said that the present older people in the committee will move out if the youths are willing to come in with the commitment to serve.

**Mr K.K. Nadarajah** of Seremban District suggested that at the District level there should be provisions for 2 ladies and 2 youth representatives and the representation at the National level should be for Districts around Klang Valley, Kajang, Rawang and Seremban.

**Mr K. Vickneswaran** (Delegate) referred to the proposal for the sub-committee for youth & ladies and described it as a win win situation. He suggested that the ladies and youth committee be formed with District representatives with the KJB Pengerusi or Naib Pengerusi in it. He also suggested that the web-site be managed by youths and that there should be a mechanism to get more youths involved and he would want to see a lesser number of the older members sitting in the Board of Management.

**Mr N.S. Wigneswaran** of Cheras District appealed to the members to forget the past and that we should discuss what we want to do. He said that the scope and function must be clear. He said that it is of paramount importance that whatever the type or organisation suggested, it must be subservient to the Board and it should not contravene the constitution. He said that the principal officials must oversee. He said that the Districts must tackle the youths to join the organisation.

**The Chairman** of the Meeting Mr P. Vamathevan in summing up said that the representation of ladies and youths rests with the members. He said that in the District or Kawasan general meeting they should get themselves elected as delegates. He pointed out that the determining factor is not the structure alone. The change would have to be gradual and would have to rightfully start at the District level.

He further added that judging from the views received so far, he noted that the ladies wing wants a body to coordinate the activities of the women. The youths want a separate body with its own management and run its own affairs with the approval of the Board. The youths want the Board to give them the opportunity to organise themselves.

The Chairman assured that the Lembaga will ensure a structure that will fall within the framework of the established organisational structure and one that would not overshadow the role and function of their respective Districts.

In conclusion the Chairman said that the Lembaga will go back and form the 2 committees and the representatives of the Districts would be by invitation of the Lembaga with the consent of the respective Districts. Alternatively, the Lembaga would invite Districts to send 2 representatives, form the committee and let the committee come out with ideas. There would no inference at any level.

## KJB EDUCATIONAL INCENTIVE AWARD - 2002

The KJB Educational Incentive Awards are given annually to students who have scored a minimum of 2As in UPSR, PMR, SPM and STPM/A Levels. The award is also extended to successful students of Higher Education who have secured a First Class Honours or Second Class (upper) Honours Degree. However the quantum for this award depends on the number of awards given out in a year.

For the KJB award year 2002, the Society has paid a total of RM54,520.00 to 210 students. The break down details are as follows.

the successful students requesting them to indicate whether they would attend and the number of people who would attend the function.

The Award presentation ceremony was held on Saturday 6th of April, 2002 at 5.00 p.m. at the Kalamandapam Lorong Scott, Kuala Lumpur. Light refreshments preceded the function.

A total of 167 students were present to receive the awards and this was witnessed by the family members numbering approximately 400. One member and his family travelled all the way from Taiping bringing along his two children who were recipients of the award. One of the parents praised such an arrangement and said 'My wife and I felt very proud when my son who scored 9As in SPM walked up to the stage to receive the award amidst the applause from the floor. I am sure my son would have felt the same way'.

The Pengerusi Lembaga, in his address appealed to the parents to ensure that the application for the award is submitted by the closing date. He said 'We do not wish to deprive the opportunity of the student from getting his or her award owing to his or her parents oversight'. He urged the members to read the Pathfinder in order to update themselves with the activities and benefit of the Society.

The awards were presented by the various District Chairpersons who were invited to the function. The Pengerusi Lembaga presented the award for the graduates with 1st class Honours Degree. The award recipients managed to pose themselves for group photographs at the end of the function.

A minimum of 30 members should have been recruited for the period 1st January to 31st December 2002. For the purpose of the competition a member recruited would mean a member who has been admitted and remains on the Membership Register as at 31.12.2002 with a minimum subscription of RM10.00.

#### THE AWARD FOR HIGHEST RECRUITMENT

A member who recruits the highest number of members (i.e. 30 members and above) will receive an incentive of RM100 + 70 cts for every member recruited.

An incentive of RM100 + 30 cts for every member recruited will be awarded to the District of the above winner.

#### THE AWARD FOR HIGHEST COLLECTION

A member who has brought in the highest amount in collection of subscription from new members

recruited for the period of the competition will be awarded a sum equivalent to 2% of the total collection.

#### SPECIAL AWARD (RECRUITMENT)

Special Award is introduced for the member who has recruited the most number of members (minimum 20) who fall within the age of 18 and 30 years. The 1st and 2<sup>nd</sup> runner up will receive an incentive of RM75 + 70cts for each member recruited, while the winner will be awarded RM100 + 70cts for each member recruited.

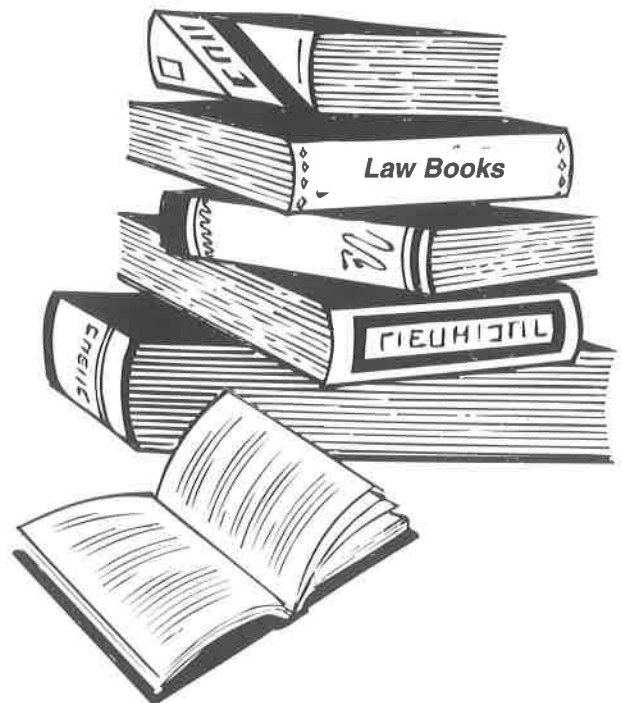

# The KJB Seminar for Youths

## *Empower Yourself Towards Excellence*

### Introduction

The Pengerusi Lembaga, Mr P. Vamathevan, in his message contained in the 71st Annual Report stated that a 3 day seminar for 80 members between the ages of 20 to 35 years is being planned to be held from 12th to 14th July, 2002. He also mentioned the rationale for organising such a seminar.

The said seminar took place as scheduled i.e. from the 12th - 14th July 2002 at the Cooperative College of Malaysia, Petaling Jaya. The participants were provided with board and lodging, inclusive of seminar materials and transport subsidy.

The Society solicited the cooperation of the districts to propose participants to the seminar. However the response from some of the districts were not very encouraging. The response fell short of the expected number of participants. Thus the Lembaga had to go direct to the members aged between 18 to 35 years to recruit them. Finally, there were 47 participants i.e. 20 males and 27 females attended the seminar.

The Lembaga was of the view that seminar was a good opportunity for the youths from all the district to get to know each other, discuss their needs and to express their views freely.

### The Seminar

The seminar was conducted with the assistance of Mr R. Gopinathan M. Ed and Ms MalarVili from the private sector and Mrs R. Sushila from the Cooperative College of Malaysia.

Day 1 - The seminar started on the night of 12th July with the topic 'Becoming a Mental Warrior' and the facilitator inspired the participants by telling them to eliminate the perception of their own minds because it has too many limitations and he instilled in them to make a commitment to alter their conditional behaviour and to challenge themselves to achieve excellence.

Four syndicates were formed among the participants in order to carry out the day to day duties during the course of the seminar. A leader was nominated to voice the views of the participants. Each participant also found his/her 'buddy'.

Day 2 - On 13th July morning, the facilitator 'brought out' the various aspects of characteristic behaviour and personality. Most believed and agreed that the facilitator's assessment of some participants character was correct.

In the afternoon of Day 2 there was a talk by Ms Sushila Devi, a lecturer from the Cooperative College of Malaysia. She dealt with the origin, definition, principles/values, activities and the organisational structure of the co-operatives in Malaysia. In the follow-up session the Pengerusi Lembaga, Mr. P. Vamathevan, gave an 'overview' of the KJB and touched on the benefits provided by the Society.

In the evening of Day 2, two topics namely, '*Role of Youths in community and nation building*' and '*JCS in the new millennium*' were introduced for deliberation by the participants with two syndicates handling the first topic and the other two syndicates handling the second topic. The findings were to be presented by each syndicate leader on the morning of Day 3 (14th July).

Seven participants representing the various districts were appointed to form the 'Review Committee' to provide a 'review' of the seminar and to present the views on the 14th morning.

There were no facilitators or interference from the Board during all the deliberations undertaken by the participants and they were free to voice their views.

In the night of Day 2, the facilitator touched on the topic of effective leadership and proved through games that team members can combine their strengths and efforts to complete tasks that individuals working alone could not efficiently do.

Day 3 - On the morning of (14th July), the syndicate presentation and discussion on the 2 given topics was done by the leaders of the 4 syndicates. This was followed by the "Review Committee's" presentation by the leader of the 7 named district representatives. The article on the views of the seminar participants as expressed by the participants through their Review Committee representative, Ms Geetha Rubasundram, (page 20). See page 23 for another article written by one of the participants, Ms Asvini S. Rajasingam.

Participants were presented with certificates at the close of the Seminar.

### Organising Committee's Comments

The participants reaction was "Three days of fun - that is how we learned about ourself and how to go ahead and not be bored by lectures in the classic lecture room type fashion."

The committee also commends the participants for they were highly motivated, disciplined, accepting the chores assigned, taking well to some discomforts for 2 nights, but above all they were receptive to the views of others. The youths should be given a pat on the back for the positive way in which they reacted to the seminar. The credit to move them goes to Mr R. Gopinathan M. Ed. the facilitator. Participants have gone back with great enthusiasm and now they have to act either on their own or through their districts to get things moving for the youths and their families.

More seminars? Yes, if the members and the parents are willing to meet the cost. However, do think of a one day get together at your local level.

## THE KAWASAN GENERAL MEETING YEAR 2002

The Kawasan General Meetings for the year 2002 was held between 16th February and 17th March 2002 covering a total 15 Kawasans. The Kawasan Meetings are held once in 2 years to elect delegates who would serve a 2 year term and would be eligible to attend AGM's & EGM's repre-

senting their respective Kawasan. The number of delegates each Kawasan is eligible is in the ratio of 1 delegate for every 50 members in benefit. Out of a total of 5403 on the membership list, a total of 4922 were members in benefit as at the date of meet-

ings. A total 92 delegates as per the eligibility were duly elected. The delegates will continue to hold office until the next Kawasan General Meeting in the year 2004 to elect delegates. The details of Kawasan General Meetings are as shown in the Table below:

## BEAUTY TIP

### BUTTERMILK FOR BEAUTY



*In India buttermilk has been considered useful from ancient times. Now its use is becoming popular in the West too for its health and beauty enhancing qualities. It is used as an effective cleanser by beauticians. It supplies the nerves and the skin with healthy ingredients and counteracts the evil effects of exposure to harsh sun. The bacteria in buttermilk makes the skin soft and glowing. If your skin has sun-burn, mix 5 spoons of buttermilk with 2 spoons of tomato juice, and apply it on the part affected. Remove it after half an hour. Mix two spoons of yeast in two spoonfuls of buttermilk. Apply the mixture for ten to fifteen minutes on the face, neck and arms. Then wash it off with warm water. This makes the skin smooth. For pimples, application of a paste of curd and Bengal gram flour is highly recommended. Apply it well on the face, then wash it off. Your pimples will disappear and your skin will begin to glow. If you are bothered with spots on your face take a piece of radish, mash it well and squeeze its juice. Mix this juice with an equal quantity of buttermilk*

*and then apply on your face. Keep it there for an hour, Then wash it off with cold water and dab the face dry with a soft towel.*

*If one has dandruff, the way to get rid of it is to massage one's hair for half an hour with buttermilk before bath. This is a sure cure for dandruff or dryness. You can use curd also, if buttermilk is not easily available and you are in a hurry. Remember that the curd used has to be kept outside the fridge for three days.*

*Sikhs consider curd the best hair cleanser. It makes the hair soft, healthy and strong. Curd should be massaged right into the roots of the hair before being washed off. It has been proved that curd is better than the best hair shampoo.*

*If your head feels hot or if you are suffering from sleeplessness (insomnia) for days, take sufficient quantity, of curd and massage your head, or you can put curd on your head and secure it with a cloth tied around your head. This will certainly make your head cool and induce you to sleep.*

*Under the Undang-Undang Kecil KJB No. 17, members are required to register their nominees with the Society. Absence of a registered nominee results in difficulties for the dependent or the beneficiary of a member as any sum due to the member cannot be easily paid out by the Society. In many cases the matter can drag on for years and the money due may end-up with the Treasury under the Unclaimed Monies Act 1965.*

*In the case of members who have already registered they should ensure that the details are updated. There are a number of cases where, through passage of time, nominees have passed away. Perhaps members should make a check and take the necessary action.*

later part of 1940 (24/10/1940).

The Vice-president of the Society Mr V. Aruppilai chairs one of the joint meeting on 13.07.1939 and moves the following resolution which Mr A. Mahalingam seconds.

"That the members of the Kuala Lumpur District Committees of the Jaffnese Co-operative Society hereby resolve that a fitting reception should be accorded for the honour of M.B.E. conferred on Mr R.N. Thamby Thurai, the President of the Jaffnese Co-operative Society and that a Special Committee of the members be appointed to take necessary action in co-operation with the Ceylon Tamils' Institutions in Kuala Lumpur." *(There is no record which specifically indicate the year when R.N. Thamby Thurai was conferred the award of M.B.E. The earlier joint meeting on 26.04.1939 does not mention about the said award. It would be in order to state that R.N. Thamby Thurai received his award of M.B.E. in the year 1939).*

The war period was attributable for the reduced activities and possibly the members were dislocated.

At the joint meeting on 24.10.1940 it was decided that the areas in Kuala Lumpur be grouped into Pudu District, Sentul District and Brickfields District.

In August 1946, The president Mr R.N. Thamby Thurai calls for a meeting but the response is not encouraging hence the meeting does not take place. Mr R.N. Thamby Thurai passes away suddenly on 20.05.1947 thus the era of Mr

R.N.Thamby Thurai Administration came to an abrupt end.

It would be seen from the records of the joint meetings that Mr R.N. Thamby Thurai was seen as the driving force and he provided the right leadership. At one of the joint meetings held in the year 1932 the President Mr R.N. Thamby Thurai in his opening address reminds the representatives that they form a part in a big machinery oiled and fitted so as to perform its allotted task to such precision and exactness so that there shall be no hitch at any stage of its progress Self reliance, faith and loyalty to the Society are necessary for the attainment of our ideals and if there are defects it is the duty of cooperative's to remedy them with constructive criticisms.

After the war when the country came under British Administration a joint meeting was held on 15th November, 1947 at the residence of Mr A. Mahalingam, No. 8 Treacher Road (Jalan Sultan Ismail) who was the president. A report covering the period of nearly five years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1941 to 30th September 1945 indicates that Mr R.N. Thamby Thurai and his committee serving the above-mentioned period retires en bloc and 16 nominations were received to fill up the 11 vacancies. Thus Mr A. Mahalingam becomes the president. A year later on 7<sup>th</sup> November, 1948 the Society under the Presidentship of Mr A. Mahalingam convened an urgent meeting inviting the Districts of Pudu, Sentul, Brickfield, Port Swettenham, Klang, Kuala Selangor, Banting, Kajang, Rawang,

Kuala Kubu Baru and Seremban. Some of the District in Perak and part of Pahang were left out owing to restriction of movement as emergency was declared. A total of 46 members were present with the President Mr A. Mahalingam in the chair.

The urgent issue at hand was to seek endorsement for the purchase of No. 25 Mountbattan Road. The President describes the property as the first class town property fetching a rent of RM400.00 per month and owned by Malaysian Planters Provident Fund. The President says that the property is sandwiched between the well-known Robinson and Whiteaways buildings and in which our Society is now based. The President stresses the advisability of purchasing this property which would enable the Society not only to ensure a permanent home in the heart of the capital of the Federation without leaving it to the mercy of land lords or chief tenants, but also to get a good return on the investment. He further explained that if the property passes into the hands of another person and if we are required to give vacant possession by the new landlord, we will not be able to get another suitable office in the locality in view of the acute shortage of office premises. He further pointed out that the Government Cooperative Societies can find accommodation in Govt buildings but we will not be able to find a shelter unless we are prepared to pay the illegal tea-money. The proposal is carried unanimously. Thus the Society owned the second proper .
